This summer several small groups have used the study "The Walk" by Adam Hamilton. In the introduction of his book, Hamilton comments: The image of walking with God or God walking with us is found throughout the Bible as a metaphor for the life of faith. As the Biblical story begins, God is described as walking in the Garden of Eden, searching for his children as they hid from him.

Later he would write that when scripture speaks of "walking with God" it is a way of speaking about our life with God. Moses instructs us to "walk in God's ways" and the Psalmist declares "Teach me your truth that I can walk in your truth." The Apostle Paul writes of us "walking in the newness of life" and to "walk by faith and not by sight."

When I think of "walking with God" I think of a very active faith that is on a journey through this life. I think of what it means to face life's most difficult situations but to do so knowing we are passing through and that whatever the challenge it is not the destination. When I think of "walking with God" I think of the active presence of God's Spirit that calls, guides, teaches and gives wisdom and peace. This Fall we are going to go on "a walk" with God. We will explore what it means to walk with God in some of the hardest moments of life. We begin this journey on August 14, 2022. Come and let us walk with the Lord!



WHY THE CHURCH MUST TEACH

Teaching is an essential ministry of the church. First, it is inevitable because of the human thirst for meaning. Second, Christianity is an historical religion, and the content consists primarily of the saving acts of God among God's people most obvious within the ministry of Jesus Christ. A believing community is hard pressed to discern the faith content of thousands of years on more than a thousand pages of scripture, except by the continuous and competent process of instruction. When the church fails to teach appropriately, false teachings will rush in to fill the vacuum.

Two concepts occur in modern times regarding religious education. One is of Biblical and theological depth of content and expression -and the other is practical church programming that may lack the Biblical and theological depth. A good teaching ministry combines these two separated disciplines into equal balance. We need to know the scriptures and biblical scholarship and relate it in a practical matter within community such as, through a Sunday School or discipleship class.

In the gospel narratives, teaching is clearly the most characteristic activity of the ministry of Jesus. Therefore, teaching should be an essential function within the Christian community. We must study, prepare, and teach to remain a viable witness to our community. Teaching may take place in worship services, Bible classes, counseling sessions, training events, choir rehearsals, and Christian homes. We must explore the Word of God and be willing to share that word with others.

I am proud of the teaching ministry of Trinity Baptist. We have specifically called men and women who answer the challenge to share Christ in their community. We have a teaching pastor that sets the example. We have teachers who research and discern scripture as lead by training and the Holy Spirit.

Thank you, Trinity Baptist for answering the call to share Christ in our community by teaching. Thank you for obeying the Word of God as revealed by Christ, recorded in scripture, interpreted by the Holy Spirit, and affirmed by Christian tradition.

Let me challenge you to join a class or accept the call to educate and share in the ministry of teaching. The life you bless may be your own.
