SABBATICAL LEAVE

A sabbatical leave is a time for renewal and learning to enrich the life of the minister and the congregation. I am grateful this fall to be granted by the Personnel Committee, a sabbatical beginning on October 9 and going through November 11. I have selected two conferences or pilgrimages to participate in. The first week will be spent at Montreat Conference Center in Black Mountain NC. I will be attending the conference "Holy Shift; Navigating Seismic changes in the Church we know". I will be exploring through workshops and general sessions the implications of the ground shift in church habits such as pew to couch, the declining church membership, weary church staff and the critical crossroads of present-day church life. My goal is to gain some navigational possibilities concerning recent trends in church work. Such as what the faith of our youth and young people are telling the American church. What is happening in culture or within leadership that is compromising the church? Is it a Holy Shift with possibilities?

Next month, I will be experiencing a Civil Rights Pilgrimage sponsored by the Academy for Spiritual Formation. I will head to Nashville, TN and visits sights in Nashville, Atlanta, Birmingham, Montgomery, and Selma. Our team will ground ourselves in the theology of Howard Thurman with our days being centered in communal prayer, individual contemplations, and small group reflection.

These two experiences are very different but can be similar in focus as I seek to explore why or if the Church seems to be pulling away from the teachings of Christ. Could we be in a movement toward a civil religion instead of a faith driven religion? What is missing? Where does our faith lead us? Can we learn from our past and begin accepting a diverse culture and congregation? How can the church become welcoming instead of fragmenting?

Thank you, Trinity, for being willing to invest in me and our church by providing this Sabbatical experience.
