Belong. Become. Be.

As we begin the month of November, we naturally turn our attention to Thanksgiving. Although it comes at the end of the month, there is something about that holiday that becomes the theme of the month in our culture. A Bible verse that has always intrigued me is 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 where Paul writes:

Rejoice always, **pray** continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

In these three instructions, Paul reminds us of the right attitude of living which comes from a living a life of thanksgiving. We rejoice always. We rejoice always because life is a gift. To be sure there are many things in life that are difficult. There are challenges we all face and there are some moments that can overwhelm us. We all know the feelings of suffering, grief and pain. We look around the world and see others whose suffering is beyond our comprehension. Yet, Paul writes to us rejoice always. Paul knew every type of suffering. He knew physical pain, emotional rejection, the uncertainty of tomorrow, and even loss of freedom for the sake of the gospel. Yet, this man could write rejoice always. It reminds us that joy is not a simple feeling of happiness but it is the knowledge that our lives are a gift from God. So, no matter our trial, we rejoice knowing that God has created us and blessed us with living.

In thanksgiving we pray continually. This is Paul's ways of reminding us that we are to live life with the constant thought of the presence of God. To pray continually is to live life in conversation with the God who created us. Prayer creates a spirit of humility. It reminds us that God is God and we are not. It reminds us that in a world that is always clamoring about who is in control and who is in power, Jesus reminds us to seek to be servants of all. Prayer, for a lack of better analogies, puts us in our place. Yet, this place is the place where we want to be. It is the place where we can see life through God's perspective and the view of eternity. This constant conversation with God builds within us a spirit of gratitude for the presence of God in our lives.

In thanksgiving we make the choice to give thanks. Paul writes, give thanks in all circumstances. In all things, give thanks. We all know how difficult that can be. To give thanks in all things does not mean we are oblivious to the pain we suffer or the suffering of others. To give thanks in

all things means we trust our God who is more powerful and always at work in our lives regardless of the circumstances. Once we recognize that life is a gift and God is present then the natural response is to be thankful always.

As we begin this month I want to say thank you to you as a congregation. During the month of October our Personnel Committee encouraged you to encourage our staff. We are all so grateful for your words of kindness, cards and gifts. We are overwhelmed with thanksgiving for you. I have always said that there are few jobs where you get a thank you note for doing your work. I am grateful to you and give God thanks for you.

I hope as you begin this month you will consider what it means to rejoice, pray and give thanks. Those three actions put us in the place where we can know God, hear God and experience God. No wonder Paul writes these three actions are God's will for us in Christ Jesus.



SABBATICAL LEAVE | October 9 - November 11

This last leg of my sabbatical is one of sober awareness. I am heading to Nashville to join with other pilgrims at the Spiritual Academy as we delve into contemplative reflection on our nation's history and participate in a civil rights pilgrimage through Nashville, Atlanta, and major cities and sites of note in Alabama like the Equal Justice Initiative Legacy Museum. It is important to face our history even when it is something we don't want to see or remember. As author Grace Elizabeth Hale states in a recent book, "History isn't distant and abstract -it's us. All history is somebody's family story." Many of us do not want to remember or know what happened. But erasing history is foundational to why racism, genocide, dominance of one culture over another and white supremacy persists today. Through my readings I have discovered some honest awareness of my own white privilege. My thoughts and focus are centered on why this is becoming so prevalent among God's people again or did it ever stop. How can the church take the lead to combat racism and change the world? If we desire a better world for our children, we need to work on becoming a better ancestor. I look forward to being back with you next Sunday, November 12..
