

# A Note from Family Promise

Family Promise of the Triangle has gone through a lot of changes since the pandemic, leaving many of our supporters and faith community partners asking if we've been able to serve as many families as we used to under our old model. We're happy to report that in 2022, Family Promise served a record-breaking 119 families! Last year, we had to close our Emergency Shelter units for two months for renovations. While we were happy to see these old apartments get much-needed repairs, we were concerned that it would have a negative impact on the amount of families we would be able to serve in 2023. However, we surpassed our expectations and set a new record by serving 127 families!

In the coming weeks, we will be sending our supporters our annual report that will go into more detail about our impact in 2023. In the meantime, we wanted to thank you for your support for Family Promise of the Triangle. Without your donations, participation in our meal rotation, and regular volunteering, our families wouldn't have been able to thrive the way they have in the last year.

### FAITHFUL INTERGENERATIONAL APPRENTICESHIP Dr. Andy Jung


"All churches grow old, but strategic churches are growing young." - Growing Young: 6 Essential Strategies to Help Young People Discover and Love Your Church

Based on Fuller Youth Institute's College Transition Project that led to Sticky Faith resources, we know that 1 in 2 youth group graduates drift from God and the church within the first 12-18 months of graduation. On top of that, 18-29 year olds make up 17% of the US population, but only make up 10% of the church-going population. This decline has a deeply-felt ripple effect across churches in the United States. For me, these are not just sobering statistics; they are the names and faces of previous students who no longer participate in a faith community and rarely engage their faith.

There's so much bad news about churches today. But in the midst of this discouraging landscape, there are great churches, like ours, that are bright spots in the midst of the all-too-often gloomy narratives and research about churches. There are churches (of all sizes and types) that are engaging young people ages 15–29, and they are growing—spiritually, emotionally, missionally, and sometimes also numerically. I believe we are one of the bright spots but we can always improve.

FYI's research revealed six core commitments that characterized churches that were growing young. At the center of every single church we studied was a Jesus-centered community—grounded in the life, death, resurrection, and teachings of Jesus Christ. But surrounding these core commitments is an understanding of the church's context. Each church lived out these core commitments in different ways that reflected their unique cultures and communities.

- Unlock keychain leadership: Instead of centralizing authority, empower others—especially young people.
- Empathize with today's young people: Instead of judging or criticizing, step into the shoes of this generation.
- Take Jesus' message seriously: Instead of asserting formulaic gospel claims, welcome young people into a Jesus-centered way of life.



- Fuel a warm community: Instead of focusing on cool worship or programs, aim for warm and welcoming peer and intergenerational friendships.
- Prioritize young people (and families) everywhere: Instead of giving lip service to how much young people matter, look for creative ways to tangibly support, resource, and involve them in all facets of your congregation.
- Be the best neighbors: Instead of condemning the world outside your walls, enable young people to engage well locally and globally with their neighbors.

Over the next several months, I will share more about each of the core commitments and how we can see things from a slightly different perspective. Keep loving one another across generations!

We thank all of our leaders in Preschool Choir, Music Makers Choir, and Young Musicians Choir as well as in Music for 3's for leading, caring, teaching, and directing our young singers this year. And special thanks to parents for bringing your children each week to engage in music activity and song since September of last year. Without your students each week, these hallways would be terribly quiet! Remember to check your calendars for starting dates of our Wednesday night children's activities for the Fall. We hope you will make music a big part of your family time and commitment as we serve Christ together at Trinity.



Family Promise has been working to end homelessness in Wake County since 1993. In that time, they've evolved and added new programs to continue to serve a growing, changing community. They now have programs in prevention, emergency shelter, post-shelter stabilization, rapid rehousing, transitional housing, and a New Lease on Life.

Family Promise in Wake County houses families in their apartment building next to their Day Center on Method Road. 
