Over the past two weeks, Robin and I have had the opportunity to travel to Spain and walk the final 100 Kilometers of the Portuguese Route of the Camino De Santiago. This is one of the three Christian pilgrimages traveled by followers of Jesus over the centuries. The first of course is Jerusalem, the second is Rome where Peter is buried and the third is Santiago Spain, where it is believed that James' body was transported and buried. The story of James death in Jerusalem and then his body being carried to Spain is a combination of history, miracles, and legend.



James reportedly had traveled the Spain to preach the good news. Thus, upon his death, his body was transported by his companions back to Spain.

What is certain is that for centuries Christian pilgrims have traveled to Santiago where they believed James to be buried. There are now many "Caminos" or ways to the cathedral at Santiago. All of these have been traveled over the years by faithful pilgrims. In recent years, walking the Camino has become a combination of spiritual journey, tourist attraction and adventure challenge. Many will walk the full Camino which requires at least a month to complete. Robin and I only walked for 7 days. So, we only had a taste of the full experience, but it was still a marvelous experience. Each day we would walk 10 to 15 miles through forests, greenways, small villages, and sometimes urban centers. All along the way we met others and learned to follow the guide signs and enjoy the journey. It will take me several months to process all I experienced but I would like to share a few things I have learned or at least have re-learned during our walk. Here are a few thoughts in no certain order:

Initiative, discipline, and perseverance lead to achievement.

God has created a big and beautiful world.

Be open to the day and to others you meet. God may be wanting to teach you something.

The Church of Jesus Christ is so much bigger than we imagine. Those who are a part of it speak every language and come in all ages, lifestyles, and experiences. A smile and a friendly greeting in another person's language goes a long way. Remember that at the local gas station or grocery store. In my pragmatism I can lose creativity. Reflection and creativity are where the beauty lies.

It is a small world after all. I met a woman from Wilmington on the first day who grew up 5 miles from me in Knoxville Tennessee. Although I am uniquely made, I am also very ordinary. Learning to embrace the joy of an ordinary life may be the secret to satisfaction and happiness.

Be careful not to seek to create God into a God of your own image. Just when you start boxing God in is when the Holy Spirit breaks out of the mold you have made.

I am blessed beyond measure to be able to have the opportunity and means to travel and experience other places. I am grateful to our church who supports letting their Pastor have a break in routine and time for respite.

I hope to be able to write more about some of our experiences and the people we met. Until then, thank you again for allowing me the time away. I am grateful for our ministerial staff and for all who gave leadership in my absence.

"I really believe that the leaders are investing in our kids not for any other type of outcome than simply to get to know them and learn who they are. And that seems to resonate with them. They know that they are truly being cared for, and that opens them up to listen to the gospel. They are not being preached at in a condescending manner or given a set of rules to follow. They are just loved on." —Andrea, parent

When I think about how I ended up in ministry, names like JT, CK, Frank, and Sandi come to mind. They saw things in me that I did not see in myself. They invested themselves in me to help me discover my gifts and passion for young people. They (along with God) changed the trajectory of my life.

In Fuller Youth Institute's research, over 77% of participants in a church that is reaching and engaging young adults well highlighted leadership as the reason their church is effective with young people. However, what stood out in these congregations was the way that leaders equipped and empowered young people to become leaders themselves within the congregation. Our research at FYI discovered that leaders who employed keychain leadership were most effective in inviting and supporting young adults to contribute their gifts to their faith communities.

Keychain leaders know how to balance the empowerment of others while ensuring new leaders are not quickly in over their heads. They are very aware of the "keys" they hold and are constantly opening doors, providing training and entrusting others who are ready for their own set of "keys."

Our research also revealed keychain leaders lead with vulnerability, focused on community, and empowered young people to envision new doors and new keys. Here are some of the top insights from the research:

Keychain leaders who lead with vulnerability must be willing to go first. In our research, young people told us that they were not looking for leaders who had everything together. Instead, they were drawn to leaders who were willing to recognize their past and current shortcomings and mistakes. Keychain leaders know how to act with authenticity and be vulnerable with others without entering into the realm of oversharing.

Keychain leaders focus on community. Young people can find great preaching and biblical resources online. However, as one young adult in our study put it, "You can download good preaching, but you can't download a vibrant community."

Keychain leaders empower young people to envision new doors and new keys. They view enthusiasm and different perspectives as a solution to problems rather than as a problem itself. In our research, we heard how listening to and empowering young people led to buy-in, provided a sense of purpose, and brought vitality and energy to the whole church and community.

What type of leader are you? Good leaders are those who are looking to empower others and ensure they feel supported to accomplish the goal. Our church has so many "keychain leaders" but we can always use more! Let's keep finding ways to encourage young adults to use their gifts and strengths for God's kingdom!


