
BUILDING AND GROUNDS

FAITHFUL INTERGENERATIONAL APPRENTICESHIP Dr. Andy Jung

In Fuller Youth Institute's research on how to best engage and retain young people in the church, we saw six principles that were shared by churches who were exemplars. We've discussed four of these principles (Keychain Leadership, Empathizing With Today's Young People, Taking Jesus' Message Seriously, and Warm Community) in previous editions of *Trinity Times*. In this edition, we tackle Prioritizing Young People and Their Families Everywhere.

In the *Growing Young*, we noted this core commitment as the **hinge point** in the Growing Young Wheel. We recognized that churches can do the other core commitments well but if they don't pay attention to this core commitment, churches tend to grow "older."



Sometimes, prioritizing young people and their families can come across negatively to people in older generations. Some see this core commitment as leaving older generations behind and only focusing on the young people. This is **NOT** the case. Prioritizing young people and their families doesn't mean that we only serve them but rather we become more intentional about asking, "How will young people be involved?"

Young adults do not want to be catered to or coddled in any way. Young adults are seeking scaffolding for their lives and for their involvement in the church. Think about scaffolding on a construction site. It allows you to build a large structure several stories high.

Putting up scaffolding doesn't spoil the building process—it makes the construction possible. When churches prioritize young people, we make sure we're providing the social, emotional, and spiritual support that they need to mature and grow into the people God is calling them to be.

Prioritizing young people regularly and consistently will help everyone rise as our church grows younger. Here is your takeaway: The next time you are in a committee meeting or planning an event, be the one who will think of the young adults and ask the question, "How will young people be involved?" Advocate for young adults and be their champion!

Family Promise Partners Needed August 4th-10th

Family Promise has been working to end homelessness in Wake County since 1993. In that time, they've evolved and added new programs to continue to serve a growing, changing community. They now have programs in prevention, emergency shelter, post-shelter stabilization, rapid rehousing, transitional housing, and a New Lease on Life.

Family Promise in Wake County houses families in their apartment building next to their Day Center on Method Road. Churches participate in the ministry by providing food and sponsoring activities (i.e., cookouts, game/movie nights).

Trinity has committed to "hosting" up to four (4) families by providing dinners, hosting an onsite event, donating money or Food Lion gift cards (\$10), and praying for the families and the Family Promise ministry.

VBS MISSION PROJECTS: UPDATE!

Our missions focus for VBS this year will be the Baptist Children's Homes of North Carolina. With over 10,000 children in the North Carolina Foster Care System, the church is in a unique position to minister to these sweet kids and ensure they are placed in safe, stable and loving homes. During VBS, we will be learning more about the Baptist Children's Homes and the ministries they offer for families in North Carolina. We will also be holding two, separate drives to benefit this wonderful organization.

- 1) Miles of Pennies. A mile of pennies is \$844.40 when laid side by side. During VBS we were able to collect \$2768.85 which is 3.27 miles!
- 2) Our second focus for our VBS mission project was a hands on project for our children- we made birthday boxes for children in foster care!

During the children's VBS mission rotation they assembled Birthday Boxes for the children who live at the Baptist Children's Home. Each child should feel celebrated and valued, especially on their birthday! We were able to collect enough items for 40 birthday boxes **AND** were able to include gift cards in the boxes so that children will be able to pick out a special birthday present for themselves. Thank you for your support with this project!
