#### FAITHFUL INTERGENERATIONAL APPRENTICESHIP Dr. Andy Jung

Most of us have stayed up too late over the last two weeks watching the Olympics. We've celebrated the moments of triumph and we've shed tears over the agony of defeat for athletes who have given their all and sacrificed much to compete in their sport. One of my favorite Olympic sports to watch is swimming. I marvel at their abilities and wish I could have a fraction of their athleticism. One of the essential skills to be successful in swimming is the ability to quickly and powerfully push off the wall when making the turn. I want you to hold on to this image.

In previous editions of the Trinity Times (*see 4.9.24 edition*), I talked about the questions young people are pursuing answers to through the lens of identity, belonging, and purpose. The questions of Who am I?, Where do I fit? and What difference can I make? become the operating system of their young lives. These questions often drive why they do what they do so I want to dig into this a little more deeply with you.

When we refer to a young person's identity, we define it as a set of beliefs concerning who one is in relation to one's personal attributes, relationships, and group affiliations. Young people often have multiple identities and the journey in their 20's is often based on how they reconcile those identities into one. Rather than defining their identity in what they achieve (or don't achieve), we remind them that they are ENOUGH in Jesus.

But sometimes telling young adults they are enough in Jesus just isn't enough. The more young adults experience life, the more complex life gets. Things that were often black and white in their elementary years become shades of gray as they understand more of the world. Therefore, as part of finding one's identity, young adults often ask, "How does my faith keep up with my increasingly complex, in-motion world?" Young adults desire a faith that is going to grow with them. Their faith journeys must negotiate new information and experiences to recalibrate their understanding of who they are and who God is in their lives.

It may seemingly not make sense, but young people's lack of attendance doesn't reflect their desire for participation. Let that marinate and sink in for a little while. Young adults in their 20's have lives that are constantly in-motion. They experience very little stability. They often don't have structured lives. So within their fluid lives, young adults are asking "Who will walk (and even change) with us through our faith journeys?"

What they need from the church (and the people in the church) is for us to be the wall. We should make space for their questions and doubts WITHOUT JUDGMENT. We should be a place where young adults feel welcomed no matter how often or how infrequently they might come to church. We need to be one of the few places in their lives that remain constant. So, consider how we can be the wall for young adults in the church and outside the church. Ask how you can be the wall for your kids and your grandchildren. That's how we help them to discover their identity in Christ.
