The Importance of Belonging

In today's world, it can be hard to find places where you feel like you truly belong. Sociologists have noticed what is known as modern tribalism (sometimes referred to as neotribalism) which points to the tendency to live in tribal society, as opposed to mass society, and this will naturally form social networks constituting new tribes. Modern tribalism is often equated with partisan



politics but it can also reference strong affiliation with sports teams (go Pack!) or other subgroups that we might feel a sense of belonging. Tribalism, most often, is seen as negative, but one thing it provides is a sense of belonging.

Interestingly, one of the questions young adults are constantly asking during their most turbulent decade of life (twentysomethings) is the question, "Where do I fit?" They feel a sense of belonging when they are connected to and can trust a community in which they can have influence, have their needs met, and mutually share emotional connection with others.

Experiencing a sense of belonging for young adults can be difficult due to normal life experiences during this stage of life.

- 18-29 year olds move more than all other age categories.
- 52% live at home with one of their parents
- Twentysomethings average 8.2 different jobs over the decade
- Many young adults are dating less, if at all
- Many young adults are less trusting of institutions, including the church

Many young adults are asking, "Who is my community when my home keeps changing, and my presence is short-lived?"

This is where the church can and should meet the young adults where they are. Community is the core of who we are. We are the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12:12-13). We can be the constant support in their lives. When everything is swirling around them, the community of faith can be the source of stability and support.

You might have noticed that we are seeing an increase of twentysomethings in worship. (I hope you have.) They are finding Trinity for a multitude of reasons but one thing they have in common – they are looking for a place of belonging. Keep welcoming them to church. Speak to them, find out their names, and help them to feel seen. You are making a difference!
