Thanksgiving is just around the corner and I love Thanksgiving because I love to eat! I love turkey, sweet potato casserole, all of the vegetables cooked in grease and all of the wonderful desserts! Like many people, I get to enjoy the Thanksgiving feast twice in one day. And, **NO** I do not run the Turkey Trot in the morning to make myself feel better for taking in countless calories in one day!

The holiday season also means connecting with family - which can bring both warm feelings and sometimes cold sweats. Especially in this post-election season, the holidays can be hard. We want to have meaningful conversations, the kinds that matter and ones you remember, but sometimes it can be hard to know what you should talk about. This can be the case for your young adult. Holidays for young adults can be hard and they can often feel like they are being interrogated more than genuinely wanting to know about their lives.

This Thanksgiving, try this approach: use the two-question approach. In other words, follow up a question with another question. This shows your interest in them and increases your chances of having a real conversation rather than it feeling like a pop quiz.

Don't panic. I have you covered. Below is a list of questions. Not every question works for every relationship so be discerning but try 2-3 of these questions with young adults in your family. Feel free to add your own questions! Maybe, just maybe, it will lead to a meaningful and memorable conversation this Thanksgiving!

- What's your favorite show to binge-watch these days? ...Why do you think that show is so popular?
- What's one of your favorite holiday memories from growing up? ...Why do you think it was so significant for you?
- If you could travel anywhere in the world, where would you go? ...Who would you want to travel with? Why?
- How are your friendships most recently? ...Tell me about the friend you've felt closest to over the last few months?
- Who do you feel understands your life the most? ...What qualities do they have that you admire?
- What's been the most challenging part of life in recent months? ...Where do you feel like you need the most support?

Remember, your young adults are not problems to be solved. They don't want you to fix anything for them. Do your best to withhold judgment and your "helpful solutions." Be present and always lead with love and empathy.

How Is Your Mood this Christmas

Howard Thurman, the great author, theologian, Christian mystic, educator and civil rights leader wrote a book about the Mood of Christmas. He states, "Christmas is a mood, a quality and a symbol. It is never merely a fact other than a date on the calendar and to the believer, an anniversary of an event in human history. The mood of Christmas is a quickening presence of other human beings into whose lives a precious part of one's own has been released. It is more wonderful than words can ever tell."

The gospel writers balanced the universal and the personal in their accounts of Jesus' birth. Born a Jew in first century Palestine, Jesus spent his whole life in an occupied land, powerless politically and with his back against the wall as noted in Jesus and the Disinherited. Into this ordinary, yet amazing birth of a child, Jesus was born to homeless parents, and like many others, that had to settle for whatever they could find – a spare room, a stable, a cave or even the open air.

They soon became refugees finding safety and security in a foreign land because of their own or Christ's own physical uncertainty within the reigning government. How many dreams have you had for a hurting and unjust world? How do you pray this Season? What is your mood? I recommend Howard Thurman's book, *The Mood of Christmas* or *The Work of Christmas* by Bruce G. Epperly. If you would like to discuss these thoughts, please contact me and maybe we can have some reflection time.

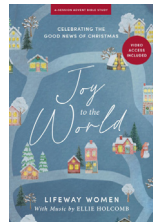

From October 18 until October 25 a fantastic team of twelve Trinity members participated in a unique mission to serve a small Christian camp outside of Santa Clara, Cuba. The purpose of our trip was to assist with the continuing construction of facilities and maintenance of crops at a Baptist affiliated site known as "Mi Campamento". Mi Campamento serves the nearby Baptist Seminary and hosts many Baptist gatherings during the year for both adults and children. The impact this mission had on the team members is impossible to put into a few words. Our hosts were one the most humble, gracious and deep rooted Christian groups I have ever had the pleasure of spending time with. Every one of them attended and participated in all of our devotionals, worked side by side with our team and treated us as if they should be doing for us instead of the other way around. Cuba is poor beyond our comprehension and to see how our hosts adapt to the strife and demands of their everyday life is incredible. Each of us on the trip departed feeling a deep connection with those we had spent the week with and very much appreciate Trinity allowing us this extraordinary opportunity.
