At Trinity one of our Core Values is Missions.

Our statement reads:

"Trinity Baptist Church values active participation in sharing the love of God through Christ with the world. We value the spoken witness, the witness through creative arts, and the witness of the work of our hands."

Summer is a time when we at Trinity have a focus on missions. Our youth are on mission trips, our VBS has a mission component and there are many adult opportunities to give, go and serve. (You will find out more about this in other articles in this newsletter.) It was my honor recently to receive on our congregation's behalf the "Excellence in Missions" award from CBF Global. Each year CBF recognizes churches



that are excelling their mission involvement. This year Trinity was selected as a church for recognition. I was there to receive the award. but the recognition belongs to you. As a congregation you continue to give sacrificially, go constantly and work with persistence on behalf of others to who Jesus has sent us to serve. I am very proud to be your pastor. I am also proud that as a congregation we are always open to new opportunities that are presented to us. It is our faithfulness, flexibility

and willingness to follow the Spirit of God that makes you truly a congregation of mission excellence. I want to thank our Mission Steering Committee as well as each leader of mission lead teams and everyone who gives, prays and goes. Let me also remind you that through your tithes and offerings to Trinity Baptist Church you are supporting so many mission partners. We cooperate with CBF of North Carolina, The Baptist State Convention of North Carolina. N.C. Baptist on Mission, Raleigh Baptist Association as well as numerous community partners. In addition, your generosity helps send Trinity members on mission in Raleigh and around the world. At Trinity we forward 5% of all undesignated gifts to our cooperative mission partners. Let me remind you of our four cooperative plans when you give:

Plan 1-Baptist State Convention of North Carolina (All funds remain in N.C.)

Plan 2-Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of N.C. (All funds are sent to CBFNC, and a percentage is forwarded to CBF global through CBFNC budget)

Plan 3-Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of N.C. and Baptist State Convention of NC. (Your gifts are divided equally between the two partners)

Plan 4- Trinity Only- If you choose Trinity only your gifts are not computed in our cooperative giving, but you do support many of our mission partners through our Missions Steering Committee's budget. This year that portion of our budget is \$119, 490. (Please remember if you do not choose a plan vour gifts are divided by percentage that is determined by those who choose a plan. If you want to choose one of the plans you can mark an envelope or contact Jan Brown in the office and she can make the designation for you.)

Thank you Trinity for giving, praying and going. You are making a difference in many lives.

At the close of each of the monthly Missions Steering Committee meetings, the agenda includes a "Pastor's Minute." It is seldom a minute and more like a moment. Most recently, I have been using that moment to share with the Committee all of Trinity's mission endeavors that have occurred in the previous month as well as the upcoming mission opportunities. The "Pastor's Moment" has become a reminder to celebrate the good work that has been done and to pray for the work that will be occurring. During the month of June, Trinity was involved in missions in the following ways: After enjoying breakfast and being

challenged by Pat Teague, our Men's Ministry cleanedup our assigned portion of Six Forks Road, A disaster relief team from Trinity spent a week in Boone performing repairs to homes caused by Hurricane Helene. The participants at Vacation Bible School collected money and items for Asheville Buncombe Community Christian Ministry, which is another way we are supporting Hurricane Helene relief. Our High School students and their leaders spent a week in Denver. Colorado on a mission experience. Holly Shaw and Robin Roberts spent a week in Nairobi, Kenya with Orbit Village scouting out future mission opportunities for Trinity. TBC Cares held a vesper service and supper with our neighbors at Capital Towers. A meal team spent a week at Truett Camp and Conference Center in Hayesville, NC serving those attending Youth Camp. Our Women's Ministry held a luncheon where they learned about OneHope Refuge, a ministry supporting survivors of human trafficking. And the above list does not include ongoing mission collections

and activities for the Raleigh Rescue Mission and North Raleigh Ministries, as well as various projects funded and performed by Sunday School classes and other small groups. Amazing! These are all worth celebrating! And as we move into the month of July and August, please be in prayer for the upcoming mission opportunities: Habitat Build Days (July 12 & August 2): Disaster Relief Team to Boone (July 20-26); Christmas in July, which includes a Food Drive, for North Raleigh Ministries; Mission **Experience in Kentucky** with Crossroads Community Baptist Church (August

16-23); Feed the Hunger Packing Event (August 30); and Family Promise (August 31-September 6). Better yet, make a commitment to participate in one or more of the opportunities above. Often, summer is a time when the life of a church slows down. This is not the experience of Trinity Baptist. Missions remain a high priority. Indeed, it is evidence of God's good work in and through us, a work that continues until the return of Christ. ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL)

English as a Second Language (ESL) refers to the process of learning English by individuals whose native language is not English. ESL helps non-native people groups survive and live in a country where they have found lifesaving refuge. They can navigate in the academic, professional and social world better.

I began this journey in 2019 when I fell under conviction by the spirit after hearing how some of the refugees were being misunderstood and mistreated. Many years ago I attended seminary with the interest in becoming a missionary. I was a schoolteacher and wanted to use my gifts as a reading specialist to teach either foreign or domestically for God......(*Continued*). My career kept me stateside and working with education in churches. A calling I enjoy. However, in 2019 I reached out to Kim Wyatt (*Welcome House*) who brought a group to Trinity's 4th of July fellowship in North Hills park. I asked her about teaching ESL and what it involved. I attended



some training at the RBA office and then began watching and observing. Later Kim asked me to help at the Smithdale apartments where there is a large refugee presence. I accepted and began teaching and becoming friends with many of the participants. Others have joined on the journey; Susan Andrews, Stephanie Stanley, Dawn Dees, Lisa Paula, Tamara Rouse, and Christine Faircloth. We all began to experience how amazingly close you become to someone who does not even know our alphabet. Sharing the gospel through education, friendship, a cup of tea or helping to find a job is powerful. One Muslim Afghan friend once said to me, "There is something about people of faith that is different from nonfaith people. They care more. They are good." I went with my Muslim friend to her mosque, and she has come to our church. Teaching a person to read and navigate in our culture where they have found themselves may just be one of the best ways to spread the gospel and be a missionary.

We are always in need of more teachers or friends. I would love to share about it. I would love to share how *Lisa Paula has helped friends find jobs*, how *Tamara Rouse has bought diapers for families* and how *Dawn Dees has held playdates with her children and Afghan friends*. God is working and using our simple lessons of the alphabet, nouns, verbs and American greetings for His glory.
